Examinee Instructions

Julia Barron, a 70-year-old, presents for an eye examination. She was referred by her family doctor after complaining of blurred vision for the past month. In addition, she complains of seeing double when getting out of bed in the morning. She has not had an eye exam for the last eight years.

You will have **twenty-four (24) minutes** to:

- Check the station equipment (two minutes; not scored)
- Obtain an appropriate case history
- Clarify and address the patient's concerns
- Conduct a focused and relevant examination including:

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As you proceed with the **physical examination**:

- Ensure appropriate infection control throughout.
- Approach the exam as if you are to do all procedures for **both eyes**.
- Start each skill or procedure on the **right eye**.
- Give the patient the appropriate instructions and verbalize to the examiner what you are doing at each step.
- Verbalize all findings, both normal and abnormal.
- You may be prompted with results at various stages of the interaction.

Note:

At the **twenty-four (24) minute** mark, you will have **six (6) minutes** to answer the examiner's questions related to the scenario. You have **thirty (30) minutes** in total for this station.
